Heroes of the Faith in August

Saint Bernard of Clairvaux

August 19

Of this man, St. Martin Luther (Feb. 18) once said, "He was the best monk that ever lived, whom I admire beyond all the rest put together." An abbot of the Cistercian order 400 years before the Reformation, St. Bernard is especially remembered among Lutherans for his hymns: "Jesus, the Very Thought of You," "O Sacred Head Now Wounded," "Jesus, King Most Wonderful," and "Wide Open Are Your Hands." Frequently embroiled in church politics during his life, it is Bernard's devotion and song that endure after his death.

Saint Samuel

August 20

St. Samuel, as a small boy, once informed the high priest, Eli, that he had heard a voice calling his name. That voice was the Lord, who called Samuel into His priesthood and worked through him to anoint both Saul and St. David (Dec. 29) as kings over Israel (1 Samuel 9-16). He served as high priest after Eli and guided Israel through its transition into monarchy. Samuel's life testifies to God's steadfast love for His people and His inclusion of young children in His divine plans.

The Bishops Resource Fund

The Neighbors' Place

(TNP) is located at 745 Scott Street, Wausau. TNP is a unique, locally-supported nonprofit organization with a strong multi-cultural and multi-faith heritage. Their mission is a simple one: to help people in need. In order to meet their mission, they provide a number of programs and services to members of the Marathon County community. These include: a food bank, furniture & basic needs bank, community learning center, youth education, community gardens, and Christmas assistance. They are able to provide support to people in need with the help of businesses, organizations, and individuals who donate their time, money, and other resources.

How Our Mission Dollars Work

In the column to the left of this announcement, you see our "mission emphases" for this month. These emphases are selected as part of our "mission budget," which is separate from the general budget. Unlike many congregations, Zion does *not* designate a portion of its general budget for "mission giving" or support of the larger church. Recognizing that everything that we share with the Church supports the mission of the Gospel, Zion has kept the general budget dedicated to the local ministry of the congregation. Then, in addition, Zion maintains this robust mission budget alongside the general budget. Within this mission budget, the schedule of mission emphases are selected for targeted giving each month that you may or may not designate on your giving envelope. This approach ensures that individual contributions go where the individual chooses to direct them within the broader witness of the Church.

ELCA Churchwide Assembly

You may have heard in the news that the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America

(ELCA) voted to become a “sanctuary church” at its churchwide (national) assembly. This vote has sparked controversy because a) there are various interpretations as to what it means, and b) it appears to support the “sanctuary movement” which has sometimes housed illegal immigrants in the United States, contrary to state and federal law. Please know that this vote of the national ELCA organization is not binding on local congregations, which are distinct legal and constitutional entities. It only directs the work of the churchwide offices in Chicago. More importantly, the vote does not and cannot supersede the teaching of our Lord Jesus Christ, handed down through the apostles, that Christian believers are to be “subject to the governing authorities” (Romans 13:1). Called to show compassion to all, Christians are to strive to do so in harmony with the law of the nations in which they live, whose “appointed times and boundaries” are determined by God (Acts 17:26).

Personal Care Kits
