





The human body was made to bridge two realms: the invisible, eternal realm of God and the visible, temporal realm of his creation. *Created as* they were in God's image, all human bodies were *meant to be* holy even as God is holy. Thus, human bodies do not just belong to this world, but also to the eternal world of God. They are meant to *reflect the* triune God bodily in their life and behavior . . .

. . . But through God's Son, who took on a human body to re*claim us bodily* for fellowship with God the *Father*, our bodies once again become what they were meant to be. By our faith in Jesus and union with Him, our bodies share in His holiness by being filled with the Holy Spirit. They become temples of the Holy Spirit (1 Cor. 6:19). As shrines where God resides, they share in His hidden glory and display it by word and deed to the world...

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

ting on the right side; and they were alarmed. ⁶But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. ⁷But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." ⁸So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.

The risen Lord interacts with us bodily in Holy Communion. There He gives us His own living body and blood to eat and drink . . . There, says Paul in 1 Corinthians 10:16-17, we are all united with each other as members of His body, because we have all participated in His body, just as we have eaten from the same loaf of bread. *His body,* given to us as our holy Spirit-filled food (1 Cor. 10:3), draws us together in a holy community that is both physical and spiritual . . .



WORDS OF INSTITUTION

P: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when he was betrayed, took bread; and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to the disciples and said: "Take, eat; this is my body, which is given for you. This do in remembrance of me."

In the same way also he took the cup after the supper, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying: "Drink of it, all of you; this cup is the new testament in my blood, which is shed for you for the forgiveness of sins. This do, as often as you drink of it, in remembrance of me."

LORD'S PRAYER

- P: Lord, remember us in your kingdom, and teach us to pray:

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 \dots Christ's body and blood do not just benefit us for our life on *earth; they* give us access to heaven itself as we live on earth. In Hebrews 10:19-21, we are taught that just as the flesh of *Jesus is "the* new and living way" into God's presence, so His blood makes us fit for safe entry by that way into the heavenly sanctuary in the divine service of worship . . .

DISTRIBUTION

The congregation is ushered forward for Communion. You may receive the holy Blood from an individual cup or the chalice. Those who do not commune may cross their arms over their chest to ask for a blessing.

Our Lord gives His holy Body and Blood to those who are baptized in order to strengthen their union with Him and with the Church. He therefore invites to this Supper those who 1) are baptized, 2) trust that they eat His body and drink His blood, and 3) desire to set aside all divisions between themselves, God, and His Church.

... The body of Jesus is our spiritual food just as his blood is spiritual drink (1 Cor. 10:3-4). St. Paul calls it spiritual food and drink because it conveys the Holy Spirit to us in Holy Communion. That makes it food with a difference. Normally, we assimilate food into our bodies, so that it becomes part of us. But by this food the Holy Spirit assimi*lates us into the* body of Christ. We are changed into His likeness.
