Ascension

There's no Easter without it!

Our Lord did not finish His saving work by rising from the dead, but by carrying our risen flesh to the right hand of God. Without that trip to the throne of God, His rising would have a remained a personal victory for Him—but what about you?

How would you receive the benefits of His death and resurrection? Jesus cares about that question, because He is total love. Whatever He has, He seeks to give; whatever He is, He lives to share. How would His victory become yours?

The answer is the Ascension. His return to the heavens confirmed God's eternal acceptance of His sacrifice for sinners and put it to work. That's what God's "right hand" is: His almighty power to work on behalf of creation. God's power is the sacrificed body of Christ, raised for eternity.

What does that power look like in the world? It looks like a Church, the body of Christ, nourished by His own body and blood, and united with Him in prayer, love, and suffering. That Church doesn't exist to talk about God's power. It is God's power, calling sinners out the world into the power of faith.

Ascension falls on Thursday, May 9, this year. Don't miss it! There's no Easter without it—and no Church, no power, no mercy, no future! But with it, everything is ours, and we are Christ's, and Christ is God's.

About the Cover Art

Zion's spire points elegantly towards a traveling mass of clouds at sunset. Taller than many people realize (about 35 feet beyond the ridgeline), it raises a cross into the sky, so that when people look up, they see a symbol of something very low: our Lord's crucifixion. This practice of the Church marks even the heavens with the sign of our Lord's mercy and recalls the words of the angels after the Ascension: "This Jesus, whom you saw go into heaven, will come back just as you saw Him go" (Acts 1:11).
